College NSS officer Prof. Vishal Danawade organized the event.







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


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A REPORT ON Swatch Bharat Abhiyan "Campus Cleaning and Tree plantation at Jainapur Govt School"

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
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A REPORT ON Celebration of Republic Day

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

Inaugurating the event, **Dr. Prasad Rampure**, the principal of the college, remarked:



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A REPORT ON Rally on Waste Management Program at Ankali

As part of the All-India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) activity point program, we visited Ankali Village that is 15km away from our college campus for awareness on de developing & managing efficient garbage disposal system.

Disposal of garbage is a severe issue in rural areas. In rural areas, solid waste includes wastes from kitchens, gardens, cattle sheds, agriculture, and materials such as metal, paper, plastic, cloth, and so on. They are organic and inorganic materials with no remaining economic value to the owner produced by homes, commercial, and industrial establishments. Most household waste in rural areas is organic, with little inorganic material, and is non-toxic. Though solid waste generated in rural areas is predominantly organic and biodegradable, it is becoming a significant problem as the waste produced is not segregated at the source itself. This activity has been planned to achieve the following objectives

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
